It is the capital of New South Wales, and the first British colony in Australia where the first European settlers landed in 1788. Due to its mild climate and the country's stable democratic government, Sydney becomes a popular destination for immigrants; today, Sydney is one of the most multicultural cities in the world. The center of the city could be roughly divided into four areas: The Rock and Circular Quay are the oldest part of inner Sydney and offer visitors a taste of Sydney's past; the City Centre and Darling Harbour is the central business district, with many museums, galleries, cathedrals and the city's well-known Chinatown; the Botanic Gardens and Domain offers a green oasis in the city; Kings Cross and Darlinghurst, hub of the cafe culture and Paddington still maintains its 19th century charm with many fine restaurants, galleries and antique shops. It is a vibrant city of diversity and offers visitor a wide variety of activities.



Featherdale Wildlife Park is located Northwest of Sydney where Australia's unique wildlife is kept in a natural bush setting. You can hand feed a kangaroo, wallaby or emu; or enjoy a face-to-face encounter with a friendly koala - amongst one of Australia's largest private collections of Australian native animals and bird life. Featherdale's facilities include a Café, souvenir shop and shady picnic areas with BBQ's. And it is ideal for young and old with the Park level throughout and baby changing and disabled facilities also provided.

The Blue Mountains, a mountain range with resorts and small villages surrounded by the Blue

Mountains National Park, are 110 kilometers (68 miles) west of Sydney. Accessible by train and car, the mountains provide sweeping views of the bushland and valleys, eucalypt forest, waterfalls, sheer cliffs and dramatic scenery.



The Hunter Valley is a 2 hour drive North of Cosmopolitan Sydney and the region now yields more than a hundred wineries and cellar doors, embracing established areas such as Pokolbin, Broke Fordwich, Lovedale, Rothbury and Mount View. Winter brings a special appeal with mornings bright and clear, and the nights inviting you to snuggle down with a friend in front of a roaring log fire with a glass of the Hunter Valley finest Shiraz. This abundant valley now supports a burgeoning olive industry with cold pressed olive oil and other olive products. You will also find wood-fired bread, delicious Hunter Cheeses, home made condiments and sauces, and even chocolate made with chilli.

Day 01:

Full day Hunter Valley Wineries Tour. Travel north to the beautiful Hunter Valley, one of Australia's most celebrated wine producing regions. Visit the Lindeman's Winery; lunch at the Hunter Resort with local produce and fine wines. Afternoon visit to the Bluetongue Brewery and the Hunter Valley Garden Village with its boutique stores and chocolate shops. (B/L)
